Stavanger in Norway:

- The Stavanger Region has a population of approximately 240.000, within Norway in joint second place with Bergen and Trondheim, after the capital Oslo.
- Over the last 40 years, it has developed into the oil-capital of Norway.
- The University of Stavanger was created in 2004 through the merger of a number of teaching colleges, and was the first of 4 "new" Universities.
- This complements the "old" Universities in Oslo, Bergen, Trondheim and Tromsø.
